I have read with great interest your Editorial in the February 1981 issue concerning the 1981 Can-At scheduling problems. The fact of the matter is that the ACBL head office has sanctioned two regionals at neighbouring districts for the same weekend by error. Memphis has acknowledged this error, apologized many times over and assured us that they will be more careful in the future. By the time this error was discovered, both districts have found it impossible to obtain hotel accommodations for another acceptable weekend.

You will be pleased to know that starting 1981 we have set up a four-district tournament coordinating committee to ensure avoiding similar problems. Furthermore, I have gone on record by writing to Memphis emphasizing that our "District 1" has priority to the July 1st weekend, except when the first Sunday of July happens to be on 6th or 7th.

To answer your question, yes we are aware of current year's problem, and discussed this matter with Ralph Fisher. I would appreciate if you could include this letter in your next issue.

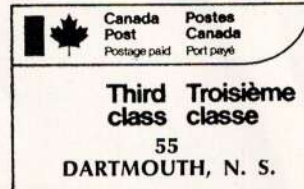
