PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE UNIT 230

Following receipt of a letter from George Retek and a long distance phone call to him I deemed it necessary to attend a special general meeting of District 1, ACBL held in Montreal at the Can-Am Regional on October 6th.

I was accompanied by Mike Hartop from Moncton and in the absence of anyone else from Unit 194 (Leo Weniger as President having no vote): Mike was accepted as voting agent for that Unit.

All six Units of District 1 were represented and the meeting was conducted by Stan Tench and George Retek (with Leo presiding).

Unfortunately, many matters of little concern to us were discussed and the last item on the agenda was consideration of the new 1991-92 conditions of contest for the N.A.O.P. vis-a-vis our two Units.

As most of you are aware, at present there are only two major pairs events sponsored by the A.C.B.L. beginning at the club level; the N.A.O.P. and the N.A.N.L.M.P., with each district qualifying three pairs. By agreement with the four "western" Units of District 1, the Atlantic Provinces, (i.e. Units 194 and 230), have been of recent years guaranteed one of the three available slots.

Next year all that will be changed as the N.A.O.P. will be split into two flights; flight A being comprised of members holding 1500+ master points, and flight B which will be comprised of those holding less than 1500 master points, and the N.A.N.L.M.P. qualification will remain the same; (i.e. you must not be a Life Master in order to participate.)

There is one other important distinction in the new conditions and that is that only two pairs from each District in each of the three pairs events will qualify for the National Finals.

Naturally, this results in two very important changes in District 1. First of all, there will no longer be a guaranteed winner in the flight A event in the Atlantic Provinces. It is abundantly clear that this is bound to be the result when one realized that Units 230 and 194 together have a total membership of only slightly over 1,000; whereas the other four Units total over 5,000 members. The 1990 figures are: Unit 199 (Saguenay) 354 members; Unit 152 (Quebec) 496 members; Unit 151 (Montreal) 2,959 members; and Unit 192 (Eastern Ontario) 1,360 members.

The second important change is even more devastating. The latest available master point listings for Unit 230 indicates that we have only six members (possibly nine by June 1991) with 1,500 or more points. I called Brian Rapson following my return and he "guaranteed" that Unit 194 has between 25 and 30 members who qualify.

According to Stan Tench all pairs must qualify first at the Club level, then at least one intermediate level, and finally a split District Final of 27 identical boards being played in each of the areas participating in the District Final, with the results to be "faxed" in and cross match-pointed.

In any event, it is mandatory that not less than five tables be played in each area in which a final is held. According to Stan and George Units 194 and 230 are (for next year at least) to be left to their own devices to work something out.

As Brian pointed out, however, several of the Halifax members who qualify at the Club level, and assuming 25 turn out in Unit 194 and play at the Club level, only 50% (plus ties) will qualify for the Unit level thus reducing the entire field (at the Club level alone) from six tables to three, and that is the total possible number of tables who would qualify for a "Unit" Final even if no intermediate stage were required between the Club qualification and the "Unit" Final. At that stage Unit 230 would have one table maximum and Unit 194 three tables. If we were permitted to combine the two Units for a "Unit Final" (the best possible scenario) we would have four tables which would of necessity (following the joint Unit finals) be split to two tables which of course is impossible.

I do not think it feasible to expect to be permitted to jump from Club qualification to the District Final. In all fairness, as Doug Heron pointed out, it would not be just to require the members from the larger Units to go through at least one more intermediate stage before the District Finals and in any event it would result in less than an even playing field in the ultimate event. I also attended another meeting with Ed Gould (our honourable president) who also came to Montreal and although Ed, Stan, George and myself discussed the matter for over an hour after the evening sessions no solution became either apparent or possible.

True it is, that members may "play up" in this event and players with less than 1,500 points may elect to play with a partner who qualifies, but it seems to me that there is a distinct possibility that the member with over 1,500 would elect to play with someone equally qualified, especially if the partnership intends to try to go on.

It is therefore my considered opinion that the N.A.O.P. Flight "A" is a dead duck in the Atlantic Provinces. I do have some good news, however, as the four "western" Units have generously agreed that one pair of the two qualifiers in District 1 who will be permitted and subsidized to attend the National Finals from District 1, will be from Units 194 and 230 in both Flight "B" of the N.A.O.P. and the N.A.N.L.M.P. events.

We owe a vote of thanks to George, Stan, Doug Heron, Mark Yudin and the others from "up there" for this gracious act of cooperation. There will be a joint final for Unit 230 and 194 in those two events and the winners will each qualify for the National Final.

I wonder, however, if anyone in the A.C.B.L. (including Ed Gould) realizes that it is approximately 2,000 miles of 5,280 feet each from the eastern edge of District 1 to its western boundary. As far as I am aware, no other District presents such an awesome east-west configuration, which, when coupled with the vast concentration of "people power" that exists in the area from Montreal west to Ottawa and even west of that again results in a strange beast indeed.

It is my considered opinion that because of these unusual facts, the A.C.B.L. should (for 1991-92 at least) authorize District 1 to qualify three pairs in Flight A of the N.A.O.P. with the format of the Finals (and how you get there) to be in the discretion of the Director of District 1 and provided further that the final round in these Units (which would of necessity be probably just one round above Club level) should be held utilizing the same duplicated 27 boards in play at all other Finals' sites. Naturally it would be played at the same time as the games at the other final sites in the District and for comparison purposes only be cross match-pointed with the other sites although this would not be strictly necessary. How about them apples, Mr. Gould?

You will also be interested to learn that although the winning pairs will be subsidized as in the past, there will be no subsidy for any team trials from the A.C.B.L. because of the C.N.T.C., which, as you know is sponsored by the Canadian Bridge Federation.

I also attempted to have the Quebec Unit change the date of the Fleur de Lys Regional to be held in Quebec City June 12th to 16th, 1991, which is certainly not going to boast attendance at the Canat commencing June 27th, but I was wasting my time.

Despite the foregoing, George Retek informed me of the "fact?" that October 21, 1991 is the only date available for the pairs finals for District 1. I assume he meant October 20th which of course conflicts with the Spud Island Sectional, as well as a sectional in Bangor, Maine and a requested sectional date from Newcastle, which is o.k., but I don't know what, if anything, I can do about P.E.I. and Bangor.

Fredericton doesn't want a Sectional next year because of the Canat. We have also had a request for a Sectional in Campbellton for August 10th to 12th, 1991 but this is not as yet official. Please someone let me know.

Sorry I can't find anything witty to say this time, but as you can see, nothing very funny has happened lately on the bridge scene. Maybe next time...
