## Kindred Krazies Konkur at Kan-At

by Jon Shute

Playing in the Open Pairs at the 2002 Can-At, you hold: **Q92 10943 A6 AK43** (Spades, Hearts, Diamonds, Clubs). Right Hand Opponent opens 1 Heart, and you Pass (you have a good hand, but the 1 Heart bid leaves you with no sensible action). LHO bids 1 Spade, Partner Passes, RHO continues with 2 Diamonds, you Pass again, and LHO bids 2 Hearts. This is followed by Pass Pass to you. Do you balance in the unbid suit (3 Clubs) or quietly sell out to 2 Hearts? The scoring is matchpoints, which favors aggression.

If you Passed, Congratulations. You get a lukewarm matchpoint score for being minus 110.

If you bid 3 Clubs, super-Congratulations! You have made a bid known around the Maritimes as a "Jon bid". I have no idea where the name comes from, but I can tell you that many times I have found partner with 4 or 5 card support for the unbid suit. In this case, all is not well. You have rescued the opponents from a 4-2 Heart fit (!), found LHO's six card suit (Clubs), and caught Partner with a dreadful hand, including just 1 little Club, all in one nice bid. Instead of being minus 110, or perhaps plus 50, you are minus 1700, and your matchpoint score is 0.

At my table, Partner **Succeeded at Bridge** by not raising an eyebrow or commenting.

Now, "for the Rest of the Story".

The next day, while playing in the Team game, we are facing different opponents who bid 3 suits and stop in a part score. This time we (note the "we") do NOT balance with the unbid suit.

Partner leads a Diamond, the unbid suit, and the man on my right (Dummy) lays down a potent Diamond suit: AJ1096, and says, "Well, she led the unbid suit."

I said, "At least we didn't bid it."

He said, "I did that last night on AK43..."

I said, "...and went for 1700."

He, stunned, "Yeah." At which point I raised my hand to slap palms with him.

I said, "I rescued them from a 4-2 Heart fit."

He, "Me too. ...They say you have to be active at matchpoints."

I, "Too bad we weren't in the same section, we'd have each gained half a matchpoint." (by having another idiot with a minus 1700 score in the comparison field).

Unbelievable.

# HANDS FROM THE CAPE COD SENIORS REGIONAL

## SQUEEZES ARE WHERE YOU FIND THEM

1. Down our way, a stink bid is defined as a speculative bid designed to disrupt the opponent's auction with no guarantee that it is constructive to your side (usually at favorable vulnerability).

NS Vul Opening Lead club Q

Playing South, RHO decided to toss in a stink bid of 3C over partner's strong 2C opener. 4NT was Roman Key Card Blackwood and 5C showed one or four. As you can see, a spade lead defeats the contract but west dutifully lead the club Q. Notice that if East had remained silent, west may well have led a spade and if not, declarer, having no other information may well have taken the 50% play of leading up to the spade King. However on the auction, I placed East for the spade ace (and perhaps the Q and J).

Winning the club ace, drawing two rounds of trumps and four diamond tricks, I ran two more rounds of trumps arriving at this four card ending. On the last trump I pitched a low spade from dummy and waited for east to play. If he played a club, I'd lead a club to the King dropping the J and my club 10 is trick 12 or he throws a spade (which he did) and I lead a spade to the king and ace and now he has to lead a club conceding the contract. A highly unlikely result without the stink bid.

Michael Hartop sitting south knew that he could make this hand if hearts were 2-2 and clubs were 3-3 but also knew that this was very unlikely on the auction. So Mike won the opening lead with the ace and ran six heart tricks coming down to the six card ending at the right.

On the last heart, West parted with the diamond Q and Mike threw a small club from dummy and he had a stepping stone squeeze.

He cashed the club Q pitching the C10 from dummy. He then led a spade which West won with the Q and was forced to lead a club to dummy's good CAK and SJ.

Here Mike knew not to play for the splits on a preemptive auction and not to cash the CQ before the last trump. He gave west every chance to go wrong.
